An opinion and order of the Honorable Allyne R. Ross, United States District Judge, having been filed on January 25, 1999; with no objections having been received; and, after having conducted a *de novo review*; the Court now adopts the October 21, 1998 Report and Recommendation of the Honorable Joan M. Azrack; granting a default judgment against the defendant, "M." Sridharan, in the amount of \$40,000; granting a permanent injunction against defendant, along with his agents and employees, prohibiting them from making or distributing unauthorized copies of "Puthayal", or any other film in which plaintiff holds or obtains domestic rights, now or in the future; also barring "M." Sridharan from interfering with the rightful distribution of such works by plaintiff, now and in the future; granting plaintiff's motion for summary judgment ordering the defendant to turn over all copies of "Puthayal" that are in his control, along with a refund for monies received from the illicit distribution of "Puthayal"; and, directing that the defendant send notice to all recipients of the infringing copy of "Puthayal" advising them that their copies should not be distributed, and that plaintiff holds exclusive rights to this film; it is



ORDERED and ADJUDGED that judgment is hereby entered adopting the October 21, 1998 Report and Recommendation of the Honorable Joan M. Azrack; that a default judgment is granted against defendant, "M." Sridharan, in the amount of \$40,000; and; it is further,

ORDERED and ADJUDGED that a permanent injunction is granted against the defendant, along with his agents and employees, prohibiting them from making or distributing unauthorized copies of "Puthayal", or any other film in which plaintiff holds or obtains domestic rights, now or in the future; that "M." Sridharan is barred from interfering with the rightful distribution of such works by plaintiff, now and in the future; that plaintiff's motion for summary judgment is granted; and, that defendant is ordered to turn over all copies of "Puthayal" that are in his control, along with a refund for movies received from the illicit distribution of "Puthayal"; and, that the defendant send notice to all recipients of the infringing copy of "Puthayal" advising them that their copies should not be distributed, and that the plaintiff holds exclusive right to this film.
