PRACTICE AND PROCEDURE ORDER No. 3

This Order shall clarify the practice and procedure in those actions seeking insurance coverage for claims based on damage caused by Hurricane Sandy.

I. FILINGS

Upon reconsideration, the directive in Practice and Procedure Order No. 1 Paragraph I D to use docket number 14-MC-41 for all filing in cases designated as Hurricane Sandy Cases is hereby rescinded. Going forward, unless otherwise directed by the Court, <u>only the following</u>

matters shall be filed using docket number 14-MC- 41 in the civil case number entry:

1. Pro hac vice motions;

2. The schedule of cases and letters counsel were directed to file by Order dated January

14, 2014 (Docket Entry no. 6 in 14-mc-41).

Unless otherwise instructed by the court, <u>all other documents should be filed only in the</u>

individual cases to which they relate, and in a manner consistent with the individual rules

of the district judges and magistrate judges assigned to those individual cases. Any

questions regarding filing should be directed to the Clerk's Office.

II. PRO HAC VICE MOTIONS

Practice and Procedure Order No. 2 is hereby amended to provide as follows:

Once a motion for pro hac vice admission is made and granted in any case designated as a Hurricane Sandy case, counsel need not file any other *pro hac vice* motions in Hurricane Sandy cases. Rather, counsel should file in the other Hurricane Sandy cases in which counsel is appearing, a copy of the order granting pro hac vice admission.
