FURTHER CONTINUANCE OF PETTY OFFENSE
DOCKET UNDER THE EXIGENT
CIRCUMSTANCES CREATED BY COVID-19

The President of the United States has declared a national emergency, and the Governor of New York has banned mass gatherings throughout the state in response to the spread of the COVID-19 virus. Moreover, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the World Health Organization, and other public health authorities have advised taking precautions to reduce the possibility of exposure to the virus and slow the spread of the disease.

The COVID-19 pandemic has had and will continue to have an extraordinary impact on this District. By Administrative Order 2020-10, in light of the exigent circumstances created by the COVID-19 pandemic and in order to protect public health, reduce the size of public gatherings and travel, and prevent the spread of the virus, all petty offense proceedings were suspended until April 27, 2020. Upon consideration of the current situation relating to the serious, ongoing public health emergency in this District created by the COVID-19 pandemic, and in order to continue to protect public health, limit the size of public gatherings and travel, and prevent the spread of the virus, it is **HEREBY ORDERED**:

All petty offense proceedings scheduled before June 15, 2020 shall be continued unless otherwise ordered by this Court.
