**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER** 2008-04

Effective March 3, 2008 and pending further order of the Court or action by the Board of

Judges, and notwithstanding any provision of Rule 50.3 of the Rules for the Division of Business

Among District Judges, the Clerk of the Court is directed to assign all criminal cases randomly,

unless the United States Attorney certifies in writing at the time of filing that a case to be

assigned satisfies one of the three conditions in Rule 50.3 (c), or involves the same specific

conduct that is a subject of a pending case.

The foregoing is without prejudice to an application by any party seeking to relate a

criminal case to a previously filed indictment or information on the grounds that a substantial

saving of judicial resources will result or that the ends of justice and fair administration so

require. Any such application shall be made on ten days notice to the judge to whom the case

was randomly assigned, and granted only upon a clear showing of the grounds for relief.
